AN INTRODUCTORY READING LIST FOR SEARCH

This reading list is based on and expands from a selection of titles presented at the launch of SEARCH at SH Contemporary on 7 September 2011.

BY COUNTRY AND REGION

A small selection of key titles on art from this region, from general art historical/art scene overviews to catalogues of landmark exhibitions, biennales and triennales.

This survey explores the ways in which Southeast Asian art has been documented and presented in print, how it has been framed both within the region and by those outside looking in. Southeast Asia has been a region in development, with ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) growing from five core nations in 1967 to its ten-nation membership today.

A sense of regional art identity emerged as a framework for negotiating cultural geography and politics – for ASEAN fostering regional ties, for Japan re-inventing relationship with Southeast Asia through cultural partnership and patronage, for Australia negotiating its place as a neighbour in Asia Pacific, and latterly Singapore establishing its place as the region's cultural hub. Meanwhile, individual visual art scenes have grown up quite separately, contributing to their respective national cultural identities. The recent phenomenon of regional art market success has amplified the call for validation through review and criticism.

SOUTHEAST ASIA ON SHOW

By the mid-1990s a number of key exhibitions brought together contemporary artists from around Southeast Asia, generating a sense of a regional contemporary art identity, sometimes framed within a larger Asian context. Japanese and Australian institution played a major role, with Singapore Art Museum emerging as a regional centre. Major early themes included negotiations between the traditional, the modern and the contemporary.

Many recent exhibitions framing Southeast Asian Art have been presentations of regional contemporary artists to audiences in Taiwan, Korea, Italy, organized by commercial galleries.

INTERNATIONAL PLATFORMS

Contemporary Southeast Asian art began to enter the international circuit in the 1990s through events such as The Asia-Pacific Triennial at Queensland Art Gallery and Asian Art Triennale at Fukuoka Asian Art Museum, which helped to put the Asian art scene on the map. In Indonesia, the Jogjakarta and Jakarta Biennales began in the 1990s as regular events bringing together largely local practitioners, with the latter introducing regional and international participation in 2009. Singapore positioned itself as the primary international platform for contemporary art in the region with the first Singapore Biennale in 2006.
